### Leadership and EOC update: May 27, 2021

Ahousaht community continues to practice COVID-19 safety precautions, wearing a mask, continuously sanitizing, and social distancing. As well as, the whole community following Provincial Health Orders by Dr. Bonnie Henry. "Travel restrictions for non-essential travel between regions in B.C. are in place until June 15, 2021. Fines can be given to people who leave their region for non-essential travel. Recreational travel in your region is allowed." - BC

- Regulation changes:
  - Essential travel into the Ahousaht community must get approval from the department manager before consideration by Ahousaht EOC. As Ahousaht recognizes some contract work is out of Island Health Region.
  - Access to Ahousaht community;
    - Everyone who is non-essential must submit an email to Ahousaht EOC. Stating who's all entering the community and where one is staying. Homeowners will submit an approval/denial, dependent on homeowners comfort.
    - This is for tracking purposes, in accordance with BC regulations of small social gatherings.
  - Community social gatherings, sports, and other leisure activities, please see the guidelines we will follow on BC wide restrictions:
